

How to Add the Drupal Publisher Plugin


With Clicksor's Drupal Plugin, monetizing your website is just a few clicks away. Add inline text ads and popunder ads and customize your site easily. With the Drupal Plugin, you can:

- Add the Clicksor tag to all your pages in one click
- Block ads from appearing on particular pages
- Display ads only to non-registered users
- Enable/Disable ads from polls, search results or forums

Once you have downloaded the Drupal Plugin file from your Publisher account, add the plugin by following these 4 steps.

Step 1: Download Drupal Plugin from your Publisher account.

Step2: Extract module files to 'sites/all/modules/clicksor_ads'.





Step 3: Enable 'Clicksor Ads' in your Module settings for your Drupal account.

1. Click on Administer>Site Building>Modules.

2. Select Clicksor Ads to enable.



Step 4: Configure your Clicksor Ads module.

1. Click on Administer>Site Configuration>Clicksor Ads.
2. Select the types of ads that you want on your site.
3. Click Save Configuration to set the ads.
